Kinesiology Pathway Program

Students who do not meet traditional admission criteria may be eligible for admission to the Pathway Program. The Pathway Program provides a highly supported learning environment that allows students to earn their admission qualifications in an alternate way. The Pathway Program also provides a mechanism for students to transition into University so they can be successful in their studies.

Successful completion of the Pathway Program will allow the student to be moved from the Faculty's Pathway Program, to a major (pending meeting further requirements of the program/major) or general program in the faculty.

Program Benefits:

- Strengthen academic skills
- Participate in reflective exercises
- Explore educational directions
- Receive guidance and support from advisors
- Learn alongside tutors in guided homework sessions

Admission Requirements:

1. English Language Proficiency - <https://urconnected.uregina.ca/apply/elp.ezc>
2. One of the following:
 - a) Five grade 12 subjects, or
 - b) Grade 11 or 12 English course plus five subjects at the grade 11 or 12 level, or
 - c) Grade 12 diploma
3. Minimum age of 17
4. Pathway Program Letter for Admission
The Pathway Program Letter for Admission should include the level of education obtained and where you attended, what you have been doing since you last attended an educational institution, what your academic goals are, and what your career goals are.
Less than 15 credit hours of attempted post-secondary courses

Education Admission Deadlines

Applications are now accepted year-round with continuous evaluation. Students can start their program in Spring/Summer, Fall or Winter!

Deadlines are now the same as most programs:

- Priority Application Deadline for Fall – March 15
- Fall – August 15
- Winter - December 15
- Spring/Summer – April 15

New Programs

Certificate in Law & Society

- 30 credit hour certificate offered by Faculty of Arts
- Will introduce students to the study of Law, and its impact on Society
- Students will have the opportunity to explore a range of disciplinary perspectives and approaches to studying the law
- Will appeal to those who are curious about how law shapes society and how law impacts the lives of people
- Will be especially appealing to students who are planning to apply to a law school or to pursue a law-related career
- Can also be done as a minor to a degree program if allowed by the Faculty

Diploma in Film Production

- 30 credit hour diploma offered by Faculty of Media, Art, & Performance
- Enables students with no previous film training to gain a diploma in film production in one year
- Will offer courses in narrative modes of film production, technical aspects and media theory
- Admission requirements are the same as those for the Faculty of MAP, but student must also have either a Bachelor's degree in a field other than Film Production, or 90 credit hours in any discipline

Certificate in Animation

- 18 credit hour certificate offered by Faculty of Media, Art, & Performance
- For students to gain grounding in film animation
- Due to course scheduling, completion of this certificate may take up to 3 years
- Admission requirements are the same as those for the Faculty of MAP

Certificate in Indigenous Economic Development

- Six course certificate program (18 credit hours)
- Delivered through Indigenous Studies (DILAC) and Business and Public Administration (DISEED) at First Nations University of Canada
- Will prepare students to engage in culturally appropriate strategies for economic development with Indigenous communities by providing students an understanding of Indigenous culture, history and current events, community research issues and methods and an introduction to economic theory and business in a First Nations context

Certificate in Reconciliation Studies

- Six course certificate program (18 credit hours)
- Offered through FNUUniv Regina campus, FNUUniv Prince Albert campus, FNUUniv Saskatoon campus, and online
- Provides a core of coursework and electives from across FNUUniv departments that will familiarize students with efforts to close the gap between First Nations and non-First Nations societies within Canada
- Features two new classes INDG 262 Reconciliation and Indigenous Resurgence in Canada and INDG 260 History of Residential Schools in Canada
