AUTOMATIC ENTRANCE AWARDS

Students are automatically considered when applying before Priority Deadline: March 15

\$3,000 - Centennial Merit Plus:

EC Entrance Average \geq 95.0%

\$2,000 - Centennial Merit:

EC Entrance Average 90.0 - 94.9%

\$1,500 - U of R Out of Province:

EC Entrance Average 85.0 - 89.9%

\$1,000 - Business Excellence:

EC Entrance Average \geq 85.0%

- Entering the Bachelor of Business Administration degree program in the Paul J. Hill School of Business

UR Circle of Scholars Entrance Scholarship

\$20,000 Value (\$5,000 x 4 years)

- 10 awards given to the top students in each of the identified regions within Canada
- \$5,000 in first year, renewable for additional three years

Education:

- Students must select the "Teacher Education Application" (not "High School Student") when filling out the application online.
- Application is sent to committee and reviewed based on (1) grades, (2) personal statement and (3) relevant experience

Nursing:

- Cut off at 88.8% (High School Entrance Average) for 2016-2017 intake
