APPLICATION INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

The University of Regina offers home-based learners the following admission options:

- A home-based learner may be admitted directly to a faculty if he/she obtains
 Adult 12 Standing through Saskatchewan Education. Such students must meet
 the regular admission requirements for their faculty of choice.
- A home-based learner, age 18 or older, may be admitted as a casual student.
 Casual students may take only one or two courses per semester to a maximum of 30 credit hours. Further information is available in the University of Regina Undergraduate Calendar. Some registration restrictions apply.
- A home-based learner may be admitted to the Faculty of Arts, the Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Social Work following the procedure outlined in this profile. Home-based learners who would like to pursue degree programs in other faculties may be admitted to the Faculty of Arts to meet the transfer requirements to their Faculty of choice.

Students wishing to be admitted to the Faculty of Arts, Faculty of Fine Arts or the Faculty of Social Work as a Home-Based Learner (3rd option) must submit the following:

- 1) An Application for Undergraduate Program Admission form
- 2) Application fee
- 3) Statement of Identification (Part I)
- 4) Letter of intent (Part II)
- 5) Home-Based Learner Transcript (Part III)
- 6) SAT I or ACT official result slip/other relevant transcripts (Part IV)

Please note that home-based learners follow the regular application deadlines as advertised in the University of Regina Undergraduate Calendar.

PART II: LETTER OF INTENT

Write and attach a letter (maximum one-page) addressed to the Admissions Office outlining your educational goals and objectives. In the letter, explain how your educational background and other relevant educational opportunities such as arts activities, athletics, community service and employment have helped you prepare for university study.

PART III: HOME-BASED LEARNER TRANSCRIPT

Provide a transcript detailing all grade 11 and grade 12 courses taken. Transcripts from a correspondence and/or a private school are acceptable or the main educator may create one. Be as specific as possible. Samples provided upon request.

PART IV: DEMONSTRATION OF SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE

The applicant must complete the <u>SAT I</u> (<u>www.collegeboard.com</u>) with a minimum combined score of <u>1100</u> on the Critical Reading and Math portions *or* the <u>ACT</u> (<u>www.act.org</u>) with an overall average of <u>24</u>. In addition, please provide <u>ONE</u> of the following:

- One University of Regina course in a relevant admission subject (minimum grade of 60%). This course may be taken through either the Accelerated Program or the Casual Student Program at the University of Regina. Please refer to the University of Regina's Undergraduate Calendar or contact the Registrar's Office, at (306) 585-4127 for further information.
- One university-level course from another accredited university in a relevant admission subject (minimum grade of 60%).
- One grade 12 course taken through a provincial correspondence school with a minimum grade of 65%. The course must appear on an official high school transcript. If in Saskatchewan, please contact the Saskatchewan Government Correspondence School at (306) 787-6024 or at http://sgcs.sasked.gov.sk.ca/.
- One grade 12 course taken by challenging a provincial departmental examination with a minimum grade of 65%. The course must appear on an official high school transcript. If in Saskatchewan, please contact Saskatchewan Education at (306) 787-6086 or at www.sasked.gov.sk.ca/.
- One recognized Advanced Placement course (minimum grade of 4). For further information, refer to www.ap.ca.
- One SAT II subject exam with a minimum score in the 70th percentile. For further information, refer to www.collegeboard.com.
